On your next Northern California tour, visit the redwoods at historic Roaring Camp.

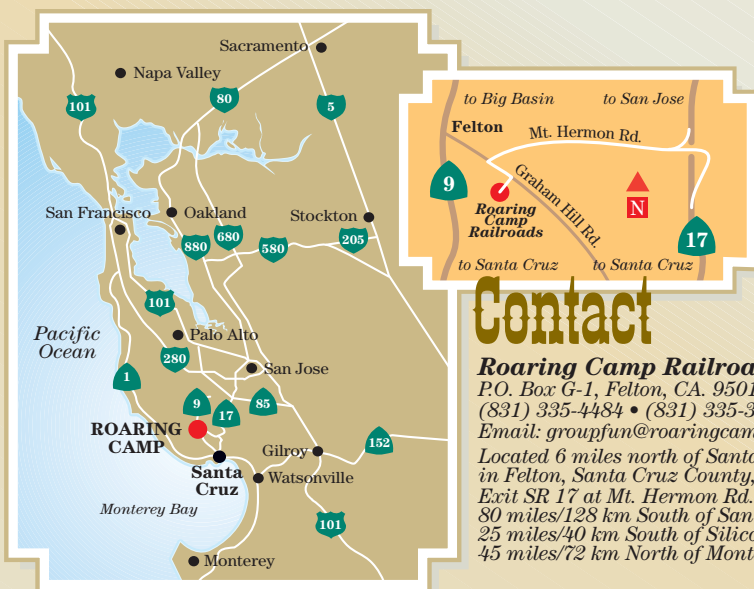
One of the best places to see California's towering redwood trees is at Roaring Camp Railroads, just 80 miles (128 km) south of San Francisco. There, the first forest of coastal redwoods (Sequoia Sempervirens) to be preserved in California in 1867 can be seen from two historic railroads.

Tour operators may choose between narrated excursions on a 100-year-old steam train to Bear Mountain or on a mid-1900's open-air beach train along the San Lorenzo River gorge to Santa Cruz, sparkling Monterey Bay, and the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary.

Roaring Camp resembles a 1880s logging town. Visitors may shop in the old-fashioned general store or explore vintage western structures such as an opera house, depot and covered bridge. Add a taste of authentic western cooking with Roaring Camp's Famous Chuckwagon Barbecue. Menus offer a variety of choices for hearty or light appetites.

Roaring Camp has many years of experience assisting tour groups. Unlike other redwood forests, there are no restrictions on size of group or motor coaches. Ample parking is available and permits to visit are not needed. Complimentary train fare and meals are provided for tour escorts and drivers.

Roaring Camp is located adjacent to Henry Cowell Redwoods State Park. A stop by their Visitor Center is a great addition to every Roaring Camp visit.
